## Infrastructure

Infrastructure refers to the facilities and systems for the day-to-day use by people to allow the economy of a city, region, or county to function. These facilities and systems can include roads, bridges, sewer & water services, electrical grids, telecommunications, and buildings including housing. All systems in one way or another are interrelated to maintain our society.

# Infrastructure Capital Projects

- 1. Leaders in our communities identify a NEED:
  - Power generation DGS maxed out, need upgrade
  - Overcrowding -Housing shortfall, need renos & new const.
- 2. Community supports as a "priority".
- 3. Leaders direct Staff (local, TC, Consultants)



# **Major Capital Projects**

- Non-core funding
- Total project costs <u>over</u> \$1.5 million
- Preliminary Project Approval & Effective Project Approval (PPA/EPA) documents no longer used.
- New process has internal INAC approval documents (referred to as DAR/PAR)
- Projects \$1.5M to \$15+M approved at Region
- Projects over \$15M approved at Headquarters

- Understand Project Management Principals, Practices and Standard Procedures
- Understand basic Contract Law.
- Rules of Eligibility, Approval Documents

# **Capital Reporting**

On all Capital Projects INAC requires:

- Progress Reports
  - Due dates outlined in project approval letter

#### Final completion report

 Due date and submission requirements outlined in project approval letter

## Progress Report

- INAC cover page template
- Physical Report
  - written summary of work done during reporting period
- Financial Statement
  - Shows current expenses, previously reported expenses, total expenses to date, and remaining budget.
  - Use budget from funding applications in spreadsheet
- Capital Reports Form
- Additional Supporting Information

# Case Study - Housing

- Review details of housing program (i.e CMHC, INAC)
  - Renovations or new construction
  - Program \$ available
  - Deadline for submissions
  - Time frame for project
  - Reporting requirements
  - Who will be doing the work FN, GC, Sub-trades?
- Complete all reporting as required in format by agency/govt. dept.
  - Cover Page
  - Physical Report
  - Financial Statement
  - Report Forms
  - Building & Utility Inspection Reports

#### Case Study - New School Program

- Letter from INAC to "Apply" for funding:
  - Minor Capital Application Form for Study
  - Environmental Review Project Description
  - Traditional Design Bid Build (7-10 yrs) or Design Build (3 -5yrs)
  - Design Build Bundling Project Implementation Cmte.
  - FN Co-ordinators and Planning Co-ordinator
  - RFP for School Study Award
  - Complete School Study (enrollment and functional plan)
- Funding Package Approved (DAR/PAR):
  - RFP for Professional Project Management
  - RFP for Gap Analysis Award
  - Administrative Agreement
  - Draft Design Build RFQ + RFP
  - Select Successful Design Build Team
  - Permits & Monitoring
